4. The March minutes, as posted on the website, were approved.
5. The Treasurer's Report, emailed to the membership on April 10, was approved. The report includes \$5,283 in receipts from Wild and Woodsy for which no bills have yet been paid.
6. Pam Grieg-Davis reported that Wild and Woodsy is on schedule. Pam asked that anyone who is willing to share with her their library card numbers and PIN numbers get them to her so that she can make copies for W & W at the library, or they can go with her to do the copying.
7. There will be a group walk of The Staircase on Friday, July 12.
8. Vance Creek Railriders is sanctioned for July, August and September. At the next meeting, it will be decided when or whether to have a group event for the club.
9. Carol Froelich will be stepping down as the CVC Newsletter Editor after the June/July newsletter. A volunteer is needed to pick up the newsletter if the club wants it to continue. Carol is willing to help the new editor and has materials handed down from the previous editor as well as the 20 issues that she will have produced.
10. If anyone is willing to be a CVC officer or ESVA representative for the next two years, Bob Morrison is looking for candidates for the upcoming election.
11. A candidate is still needed to run for a two-year term as Area Coordinator for Area 5 of the ESVA. It involves preparing a report on the activities of the Area 5 clubs to present at each ESVA meeting. It

17. The regional Walkfest will be held in and around Silverdale, Washington September 19-22. There will be 8 walks sponsored by different clubs. There will be sit-down dinners on Friday and Saturday nights. Registration starts in May.

19. There will be a memorial walk for Joy Adams on Friday, May 3 in Poulsbo. Carol Froehlich will be sending details out to club members soon.
