## Where the Salmon Run— October 5, 2024



Join us for our guided walk! Register at 9:00 a.m. We will have both 5K and 10K guided walks. Or if you prefer, you may walk alone with directions. If you choose to walk alone you may not be included in the talk at the Capitol Building. Enjoy watching the salmon run and listen to a short history on the salmon hatchery operations by a Washington Department of Fish & Wildlife representative. 10K walkers will walk around Capitol Lake to the Capitol and meet with a docent who will provide a short talk on the Capitol building. Enjoy vistas along the Deschutes River, the Capitol campus, Port of Olympia and the South Capitol Neighborhood Historic District!

#### TUMWATER FALLS HATCHERY AND SALMON SPAWNING:

Late September through early October, you will have the unique opportunity to watch this amazing natural process. Watching the salmon migration is a fantastic and fun experience. Our walk will guide you along the most scenic parts of the Deschutes River where you will have numerous vantage points to watch salmon swim upstream! The local salmon, running through four fish ladders, are primarily hatchery Chinook. At the last ladder, the fish are directed into a holding pond owned by Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife.



Enjoy the viewing windows built into the pens allowing you to get up close to see these beautiful fish! Some hatchery salmon

are released in the upper Deschutes River to spawn naturally and provide nutrient enhancement.

#### A VISIT TO THE CAPITOL:



Washington State's Legislative Building completed in 1928 serves as both a working governmental center and a symbol of Washington's free and democratic government. It is the centerpiece of the five historic buildings designed by New York architects Walter Wilder and Harry White. Conceived in the architectural competition of 1911 and selected by the State Capitol Commission, Wilder and White's designs for the Legislative Building were completed and set into motion in 1922. The Washington State Capitol building's exterior is primarily sandstone, quarried near Mt. Ranier at Wilkeson. The granite steps and foundation stones are from a quarry in Index, north of Seattle.

**WALK START POINT:** Brewery Park at Tumwater Falls (at the corner of "C" St and Deschutes Pkwy), 110 Deschutes Way SW, Tumwater WA 98501.
